

Treasury, IRS provide guidance for Opportunity Zone investments in rural areas under the One, Big, Beautiful Bill

IR-2025-96, Sept. 30, 2025 — The Department of the Treasury and the Internal Revenue Service today issued guidance on Qualified Opportunity Zone investments in rural areas as provided for under the One, Big, Beautiful Bill.

<u>Treasury, IRS issue regulations to reduce the amount of the user fee for tax professionals who apply for or renew a PTIN</u>

IR-2025-95, Sept. 29, 2025 — The Department of the Treasury and the Internal Revenue Service today issued interim final regulations and a notice of proposed rulemaking to reduce the amount of the user fee imposed on tax professionals who apply for or renew a preparer tax identification number (PTIN).

IRS to phase out paper tax refund checks starting with individual taxpayers

IR-2025-94, Sept. 23, 2025 — The Internal Revenue Service, working with the U.S. Department of the Treasury, today announced that paper tax refund checks for individual taxpayers will be phased out beginning on Sept. 30, 2025, as required by Executive Order 14247, to the extent permitted by law.

IRS extends relief to farmers and ranchers affected by drought in 49 states, other regions

IR-2025-93, Sept. 22, 2025 — The Internal Revenue Service today issued guidance that provides tax relief for farmers and ranchers in applicable states and regions who sold or exchanged livestock because of drought conditions.

<u>Treasury, IRS issue guidance listing occupations where workers customarily and regularly receive tips under the One, Big,</u>
Beautiful Bill

IR-2025-92, Sept. 19, 2025 — The Department of the Treasury and the Internal Revenue Service today provided guidance on "no tax on tips" provision. The One, Big, Beautiful Bill proposed regulations identify occupations customarily and regularly receive tips and define "qualified tips" eligible taxpayers may claim as a deduction.

<u>Treasury, IRS issue final regulations on new Roth catch-up rule, other SECURE 2.0 Act provisions</u>

IR-2025-91, Sept. 15, 2025 — The Department of the Treasury and the Internal Revenue Service today issued final regulations addressing several SECURE 2.0 Act provisions relating to catch-up contributions.

IRS assesses \$162 million in penalties over false tax credit claims tied to social media

IR-2025-90, Sept. 8, 2025 — The Internal Revenue Service is alerting taxpayers about a growing number of fraudulent tax schemes circulating on social media that promote the misuse of credits such as the Fuel Tax Credit and the Sick and Family Leave Credit.

IRS urges emergency preparedness ahead of peak disaster

IR-2025-89, Sept. 4, 2025 — As hurricane season peaks and wildfire risks remain high, the IRS urges individuals and businesses to create or update their emergency preparedness plans as part of National Preparedness Month.


